

COUNCIL WORK SESSION MINUTES

**May 13, 2020 – 4:00 p.m.
City Hall (via video conferencing)**

A Council work session was held via conference call for an update on the Fourth Amended Declaration and Order regarding COVID-19.

Attending: Mayor Bill McMurray and Councilmembers Brenda Blessing, Madison Davis, PJ Kovac, Russell Moore, Brian Meyers, Marty Novak, Kent O'Dell and Gary Roach.

Chris Connally, Interim City Manager/Police Chief; Bryan Carter, City Attorney; Debra Bradley, Health Director; Andy Clements, Public Works & Transportation Director; Tom Mahoney, Interim Administrative Services Director; Mary Robertson, Asst. to the City Manager/Communications & Public Relations Manager; Paul Flury, Network Administrator; and Paula Heyde, City Clerk.

Mayor Bill McMurray called the meeting to order.

Mayor McMurray asked Bryan Carter, City Attorney, to review the proposed tavern and bar regulations.

Mayor McMurray and Councilmembers Madison Davis, PJ Kovac, Marty Novak, Kent O'Dell and Gary Roach supported allowing bars and taverns to open beginning Thursday (May 14). Councilmember Myers would like to wait until next Monday for them to open. Councilmembers Brenda Blessing and Russell Moore were not in favor of them opening.

The following individuals spoke on the issue: Chris Kelly, Kelly's Pub; Kim Bigham, Big Shots; Tim Lawrence, Munny Inn; Lori Brown and Rusty Summers.

There was a consensus to change the hours that alcohol sales would have to cease from 11:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday and from 10:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday.

Debra Bradley, Health Director, said Mosaic is having a drive-thru COVID-19 testing site this weekend.

Another work session was scheduled for next Thursday, May 21 at 4:00 p.m. to review the COVID-19 numbers.

The meeting adjourned at 4:58 p.m.

Taverns and bars shall implement the following practices:

- (1) **Apply the practices described in Section 5 to employees and contractors** working at the business facility.
- (2) **Apply the practices described in Section 6.**
- (3) Assign all parties to tables or marked standing areas and limit bar stools and seating to one seat every six feet.
- (4) Require advanced reservations or immediate seating/placement of parties.
- (5) Prohibit customers from congregating or waiting inside or outside the business to be seated/placed.
- (6) Require all servers and drink preparers to wear face coverings.
- (7) Require cashiers to wash hands, use hand sanitizer, or change gloves before touching drinkware.
- (8) Take and deliver orders only at the following locations:
 - a. Tables at which customers are seated.
 - b. Marked areas in which customers are assigned.
 - c. Specified and marked areas at bars, which are six feet from all seating or marked standing areas.
- (9) Serve drinks in disposable cups; refrain from reusing all cups and glasses.
- (10) Refrain from making reusable condiment containers (e.g. salt/pepper shakers, ketchup bottles, etc.) and menus available to customers unless the containers and/or menus are sanitized between parties accessing them.
- (11) Record the name and phone number of a member of all parties and the dates and times during which the parties were in the tavern or bar; provide the recorded information to the City's Health Department when necessary to trace COVID-19 contacts.
- (12) Cease serving customers and close no later than 11:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday nights and 10:00 p.m. on Sunday through Thursday nights.
- (13) Comply with restaurant requirements included in the state order imposed by Dr. Randall Williams, Director of Health and Senior Services for the State of Missouri, dated April 27, 2020, which is in effect until 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, May 31, 2020, as follows: limitations on social distancing and other precautionary public health measures must be in place, including proper spacing of at least six feet (6') between tables, lack of communal seating areas to parties that are not connected, and having no more than ten (10) people at a single table.
