Chief Connally explained what we have been doing (Live at 5, Radio segments, and social media). Karen Petree brought up concerns about the Facebook Crimewatch pages, and Chief Connally and the Commanders explained how the pages work and who runs them.

Chief Connally discussed an award our Communications Center received from the Association of Public Safety Communications Officials for their Christmas in July fundraiser. Chief Connally also discussed Sgt. Strong's receipt of the Mary Jolly award from the YWCA.

Chief Connally then made a presentation to the board on current crime numbers and trends.

Chief Connally then spoke about our community outreach efforts including national night out, our mentoring program at Edison, our literacy program for 2nd graders, our K-9 school searches at the

request of the SJSD, the drug take back program, and our ongoing helicopter crime prevention projects.

The board was then taken to the Electronic Crimes Unit for a tour and presentation on the capabilities of the unit provided by Commander Hart.


