Bryan Carter has been named as St. Joseph's next city manager. Following a review of the top 17 finalists from a field of 50 applicants, City Council met and discussed their pick for the top administrative position for the organization. Their decision to hire Carter was unanimous.

Carter graduated from Creighton University School of Law with his Juris Doctor, cum laude. He also has a Master of Business Administration in Operations Management and Marketing as well as a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration. He began his career with the city of St. Joseph in 2011 as assistant city attorney and named city attorney in 2015.

Carter has served as the interim city manager since early January. According to Mayor Bill McMurray, "Bryan willingly and energetically stepped into the interim role and has been impressive since the first day." McMurray, along with the rest of the Council, feels Carter has the qualities necessary to effectively serve as city manager citing, "Bryan is very familiar with the organization and all aspect of the services we provide. He is responsive, detailed, and possesses excellent communication skills. He is well-respected by his peers and volunteers extensively in the community. Bryan has the qualities the City Council was looking for in a city manager and will provide a seamless transition."

Pending the execution of a contract to be first read at the City Council meeting on May 3, the interim title will be removed, and Carter will officially be named the city manager. His salary will be \$169,000.

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
